- 1. The National Center for State Courts is sponsoring a contest for elementary, middle school, and high school students. The contest entries will be divided into three groups: 3rd-5th graders, 6th-8th graders and 9th-12th graders. This year's theme honors the 100th anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment, which gave women the right to vote.
- 2. The **Elementary** (3rd-5th grade) and **middle** school (6th-8th grade) students are encouraged to answer the following question in **100 words or less:** Why is it important that all citizens have the right to vote?

1st place: \$ 300 (15,000.00php) 2nd place: \$ 150 (7,500.00 php) 3rd place: \$ 100 (5,000.00 php)

Middle School:

1st place: \$ 400 (20,000.00 php) 2nd place: \$ 200 (10,000.00 php) 3rd place: \$ 100 (5,000.00 php)

The High school (9th-12th grade) students are encourage to answer the following questions in *600 words or less:* Is voting a right, privilege or responsibility? Why?

High School:

1st place: \$ 1000 (50,000.00php) 2nd place: \$ 500 (25,000.00 php) 3rd place: \$ 250 (12,500.00 php)

Rules for essay contest:

■ Entries for elementary school (3rd-5th grade) and middle school (6th-8th grade) students must be 100 words or less.

Entries for high school (9th-12th grade) students must be 600 words or less.

Deadline of submission Friday, February 21, 2020.

- 4. First, second, and third place winners from each grade level will be selected by NCSC staff members and judges from around the country based on creativity, originality, overall quality and adherence to the theme. The winners will be notified by e-mail or phone by April 17, 2020. Winning entries may be shared on NCSC's social media outlets, as well as NCSC publication websites.

Contest Rules & Regulations

- 1. The contest is open to 3rd-12th grade students.
- All entries must be uploaded in the form on NCSC's website at www.ncsc.org/contest. This is the preferred method
 of entry. However, hand-written essays may be submitted by mail to NCSC, c/o Deirdre Roesch, 300 Newport
 Avenue, Williamsburg, Va., 23185.
- 3. Each entrant must answer the question in their own words.
- Elementary (3rd-5th grade) or middle (6th-8th grade) school students' essays should not exceed 100 words for students. High school students' essays should not exceed 600 words.
- 5. There is no entry fee.
- Entries may be submitted through NCSC's website beginning November 1, 2019. The deadline for submissions is 11:59 pm (EST,US) on Friday, February 21, 2020.
- 7. All portions of the online entry form must be completed when you upload your essay in order for it to be eligible.
- 8. The finalists will be judged by staff members of the National Center for State Courts on creativity, originality, overall quality and adherence to the theme.
- 9. The decision of the judges is final.

Awards will be presented as follows:

3rd-5th grade age level

One (1) First Place: \$300
One (1) Second Place: \$150
One (1) Third Place: \$100

6th-8th grade age level

One (1) First Place: \$400
 One (1) Second Place: \$200
 One (1) Third Place: \$100

9th - 12th grade age level

One (1) First Place: \$1,000
One (1) Second Place: \$500
One (1) Third Place: \$250

Contest Rules & Regulations (cont.)

- 10. Entrants grant NCSC the right to use their names, photographs, statements, quotes and testimonials for advertising, publicity, and promotional purposes without notification or further compensation. - 12. Entrants agree to be bound by the official contest rules and decisions of the judges.
- 13. The failure to submit required information and forms, or any false statements or misrepresentations made by the entrant, shall constitute a violation of the official contest rules and subject the entrant's submission to immediate disqualification.
