1. #### **Course Information Brief and Guidelines**

#### Introduction to the Course

Data analysis is the goal of many government agencies at the national and regional levels, as this is important to ensure that officers and technical staff in charge of these roles should have basic knowledge of public health and disease surveillance, since these are essential in developing skills in data analysis, communication and decision making for public health.

This is a four-part course that aims to introduce school officials and school health officials to public health, prevention of common diseases in children, disease surveillance and pandemics, and how public health data are collected, analyzed, reported and used.

#### Who are participating?

School administrators, safety officers, school physicians, school nurses, and teaching staff. Optional participants may include the Covid19 focal person from the Region and parent representative of public schools in the Philippines.

#### The course team (Philippine Society of Public Health Physicians)

PSPHP is a society of physicians and public health professionals dedicated to guide community, local government, agency, health organization, medical office or program in pursuit of group, community, and societal health goals. For this course, the PSPHP will work closely with the participants as facilitators to assist and guide them in their learning experience.

#### How is the course organized?

This online course is composed of 16 modules, divided into 4 parts with 4 modules per part.

Each module includes a series of 4 – 5 recorded video lectures that complements the downloadable PDF reading material. In total, each module is expected to run for 30 minutes.

The materials are available online via Moodle accessible in webform and mobile form, with 2 synchronous sessions at the start and end of course. Synchronous sessions will also serve as orientation session and integration/synthesis session.

#### Part 1. Introduction to Public Health in Schools

The participants will be introduced to the concepts of public health and how it relates to the different programs of the Department of Education; likewise, the participant will see the interconnection and influence of the different sectors of society, how each affect and contribute to public health, and the role of people both individually and collectively.

#### Part 2. Prevention of Common Diseases in Children

Modules included in Part 2 will expose the participants to specific health conditions affecting children in school and in the community. A better understanding of the different risks and causes of such illnesses will aid in the proposal of interventions to prevent these disease conditions from happening and progressing.

#### Part 3. Public Health Surveillance

Lectures and discussion on Outbreaks and Epidemics are included in Part 3. Activities related to pandemic response and disease surveillance will involve both theoretical and experiential case sharing, especially during the Covid pandemic.

#### Part 4. Using Public Health Data

Modules on data collection, analysis, reporting, dissemination and utilization are included in Part 4, and more importantly, how these data and information will assist in appropriate and adequate decision making for the school, the community and other stakeholders. Planning, implementation and evaluation of proposals and interventions will likewise enable the participants to use their previously acquired learnings.

#### What are the course assignments?

As part of the course, you will be invited to participate in the following individual and group activities.

#### **Individual Activities**

#### Online discussions and Group interactions

Online discussions organized throughout the course will constitute a very valuable tool for exchanging experiences and reflections between the different teams participating in the course, as well as with the course facilitators. Facebook Page will be used for this purpose to enable personal reactions and synchronous video sessions. For each online discussion you are required to post a message responding to the questions for reflection.

#### Post assessment in each module and Pre and Post test

You must complete an objective type of test for each module. You will also answer a 20-item pretest (ungraded) before the start of the course an another 20-item post test by the end of the course (graded).

#### How to utilize the e-earning platform?

Moodle access will be provided for all enrolled participants of the course. A strong internet connection is required to access all course materials. You may download the materials and access them offline. All modules can be accessed using smartphones, tablets, laptops or desktops.

#### Certification

Upon completion of course requirements with at least 70% grade, you will receive a Certificate of Completion. By week two of the course, if you cannot commit your time to complete the course, please notify us for dropping of the course so we can provide a replacement as needed.
