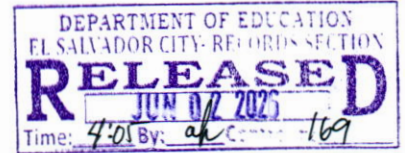

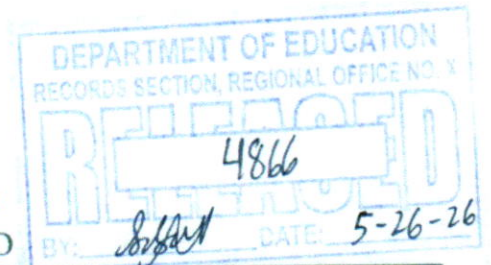

ADOPTION OF THE ENHANCED PROCESS
FOR PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW (PIR)

1. In line with the Department's commitment to strengthen results-based management and ensure the efficient utilization of resources, there is a need to enhance the existing process of the Program Implementation Review (PIR). The improved process aims to promote data-driven decision-making, strengthen accountability, and ensure the alignment of program implementation with organizational targets and priorities.
2. This Memorandum is issued to adopt and institutionalize the enhanced process for the conduct of the Program Implementation Review (PIR) at the Regional, Division, District, and School levels. Specifically, it aims to:
 - a. Strengthen the implementation of monitoring and evaluation, particularly the operationalization of the Basic Education Monitoring and Evaluation Framework across school, division, and regional levels;
 - b. Adopt the quarterly Program Implementation Review (PIR) technology as a monitoring and evaluation mechanism to track the progress of programs and projects and to identify gaps, issues, concerns, and implementation bottlenecks;
 - c. Determine appropriate corrections and actions needed to refine plans and ensure the continuous improvement and smooth implementation of programs and projects; and
 - d. Formulate Catch-Up Plan for the delays of program, project, and major activities implementation.
3. The enhanced PIR process shall be implemented in all governance levels, including:

- a. Regional Office (RO)
- b. Schools Division Offices (SDOs)
- c. Public Elementary and Secondary Schools

4. This complements the national commitments and 5-Point Reform Agenda of the Department in delivering basic education in this region. It is also aligned with the Quality Basic Education Development Plan (QBEDP) 2025-2035, Budget Accountability Report 1 (BAR 1) and Region Education Development Plan (REDP 2023-2028).

- a. Indicative Schedule of Activities
- b. Indicative Schedule of Indicators of Program Implementation Review (Region/Division)
- c. Indicative Schedule of Indicators of Program Implementation Review (District/School)

6. All previous regional memoranda and related issuances inconsistent with these guidelines are hereby repealed, rescinded, or amended accordingly.
