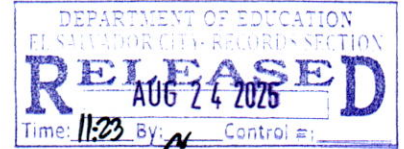

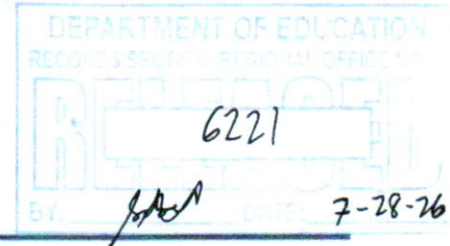

2026 REGIONAL CLIMATE CHANGE CARAVAN (RCCC)

1. The Department of Education – Northern Mindanao, through the Special Program and Projects Section (SPP) – Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM), will be conducting the 2026 Regional Climate Change Caravan (RCCC) at Baybay Elementary School, Misamis Oriental, on August 23-25, 2026, with focus on tree planting as an environmental conservation initiative.
2. The activity aims to promote climate change awareness, increase green spaces, and encourage the active participation of schools in fostering environmental stewardship. Tree planting plays a vital role in creating a greener, healthier, and more conducive learning environment.
